
Prohibition of Mixed Marriages Act 1949

Whites and Blacks are not allowed to marry each other




Population Registration Act 1950

Creation of a national register in which everyone's race was recorded as one of three categories: white, black (African) or coloured (Mixed descent). Classification was based on appearance, social acceptance & family history.




Group Areas Act 1950

Created different residential and business areas for each race. Begun the forced resettlement of 9 million people for living in the "wrong" area such as Black Africans living in District 6 in Cape Town.




Land Acts 1954 & 1955

Restricted non-white residence to specific areas, reinforcing minority white control over 80% of the land in the country.



Bantu Authorities Act 1951

Created 10 Black African "homelands" where Black Africans were sent in their hundreds of thousands.



Bantu Homelands Citizenship Act 1970

Made every Black African a citizen of a "homeland" and therefore not a citizen of South Africa. 9 million people began to need passports to get out of their homeland and into the rest of the country.
